Membership



Total membership of 231 (104 chapter-only, 127 national)

- Increase from last year! (213)
- Twelve Planning Board chapter-only memberships
- Added five new planning boards after email sent in September
- Weekly e-news available only to members
- Increased chapter only rates to \$35 (from \$25) to be more in line with other chapters



Legislative

 Thirty-five+ member Legislative Committee, which includes representation from the RI League of Cities and Towns.

More help is ALWAYS needed and welcome!

- Work with Statewide Planning, RILOCAT, GrowSmart RI, and others to monitor bills and form alliances for testimony.
- Many letters of support and opposition were filed this past year.
- Actively working with senators and representatives to have a seat at the table.
- Significant package of housing bills passed last session, further amendments to land development law may be coming in the 2024 session

- Susan Mara of Weston & Sampson was elected President-elect.
- Glenn Modica and Stacy Wasserman were re-elected to the positions of Treasurer and Secretary, respectively.
